

Berlin in Cincinnati: Scenes from the End of an Intellectual Tradition

A vital center of Jewish higher learning, the Berlin Hochschule für die Wissenschaft des Judentums (1872–1942) is part of a larger story about the persecution and subsequent flight of the intellect in Europe. My presentation will look at the final phase of this institution of liberal Judaism through the lens of Cincinnati, based on original sources from the American Jewish Archives. The focus here will be on the end of a small but important rabbinical college, comprising its last years and immediate afterlife. This overview includes scholars like Ismar Elbogen, Jacob Rader Marcus, Leo Strauss, Eugen Täubler and Alexander Guttmann. As will be shown, the end at least partly denotes a transition. Rather than providing a comprehensive account of a wide and fractured subject, the aim here will be a perspectivation of historical experience through a series of notable scenes and encounters.
